WRITING A CLASSIC & CONTEMPORARY TALE

Writing our fifth script for The Gaiety Theatre has brought us to the most famous pantomime story of all - Cinderella. There was an immediate sense of trepidation mixed with excitement as we wrestled with the opportunity to bring this muchloved story to life. As usual, our starting point has been to look at the origins of the famous fairytale. It dates back as far as the Ancient Greeks but the version we've come to know and love in the Panto world is largely based on Charles Perrault's late 17th-century tale 'Cendrillon' (or 'The Little Glass Slipper'). We were keen to hit all the tale's well known story points and to give it a traditional pantomime fairytale setting but, as ever, we wanted to find our fresh take on it for a panto being staged in 2023.

Telling a good story is our foremost objective in writing our scripts - and making sure that the title character is front and centre of that story. Too often we've sat through productions where Cinderella is meek and two dimensional or even sidelined, serving the story we all know rather than driving the action forward as a living breathing character. With our 'Cinderella' we were keen to create a strong, modern, quirky, and spirited character who has fallen on hard times. The central theme of most versions of Cinderella finds the title character being oppressed by her 'Step' family and the same is true in our version but our heroine tries not to be a victim, but rather make the most of what she's got – and she's got plenty to say about the world when she sees injustice!

There are also huge opportunities for music, dance, comedy and magic in the story and we've tried to maximise those – drawing on the traditions of Scottish Variety panto here at The Gaiety and our love of musical theatre.

We've been really lucky to be able put together a stunningly skilled cast of performers along with a terrific creative and production team. It's been great to know who we've been writing for, too, which has allowed us to make the most of the talents of those involved.

We hope that you will find lots to recognise and enjoy in our 2023 pantomime as well as plenty of surprises along the way. Enjoy!

After training and graduating as an actor from the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama, Fraser immediately took up writing, in particular comedy writing.

His earliest writing work appeared in the Comedy Unit's Roughcuts Podcast, BBC Radio Scotland's Funny Turns and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. He wrote and produced his own radio comedy sketch show 'Macabre Cabaret' and did some stand-up comedy himself for a time. He wote and produced two original theatre shows at the Ayr Gaiety with Jerry Taylor in the form of the 'Taylor and Boyle Show' then 'Taylor and Boyle: Licence To Tickle Your Fancy'. More recently Fraser wrote the touring productions 'The Dolls Abroad' and 'The Dolls Dragged Up' with comedy double act The Dolls, and three Christmas shows for the UK Theatre School's annual Christmas showcase - 'Christmas by Committee', 'The Party' and 'The Switch-On'.

Since 2019 Fraser has been writing pantomimes with Ken Alexander for The Gaiety. Their first was lack and the Beanstalk in 2019, then the pandemic struck and some creative thinking was required. The Scunner That Stole Christmas appeared on The Gaiety's Youtube channel for 2020 and the one act pantomime Jamie and the Unicorn happily appeared back on stage in 2021. 2022's Sleeping Beauty was years in the making, as Ken and Fraser began writing in 2020, so they were delighted by the 5-star acclaim it received! They have already begun writing Mother Goose for 2024. Fraser has also written the new comedy musical 'Hen Night Horror' with his panto sister Ali Cleland, which will appear in theatres in 2024.

At Glitter Pantomimes, every set has been personally designed by Mark, giving the company its own unique in-house style, and attention to detail that is rarely seen within the theatre hire industry. Glitter currently has a Midlands based office in Nottingham, with stores, workshop and wardrobe departments based in Liverpool. The company has a team of dedicated theatre professionals on hand including carpenters, production managers, painters, prop makers and wardrobe supervisors, who oversee every aspect and detail involved in the production process of the scenery and costumes.
