INTRODUCTION

Our sixth year writing pantomime for the Gaiety had brought us to the title of Mother Goose - the Dame's Panto.

Usually, when writing pantomime we go back to the classics, the original source material - The Brothers Grimm, Charles Perrault and the like - for inspiration. But with Mother Goose (although it does borrow from Aesop's Fable The Goose That Laid the Golden Eggs) there is no original story, no starting point. Instead, Mother Goose is a collection of stories and tales about other characters, told by the matriarch herself.

But of course, Mother Goose is a famous pantomime that has been staged numerous times in many theatres. In fact, the Mother Goose story first appeared on stage in a pantomime way back in 1806. Fraser's first Pantomime was Mother Goose in 2008 and in 2023 Ken went to see Ian McKellen's celebrated Mother Goose at Liverpool Empire - as well as having loved Stanley Baxter's and Walter Carr's versions many years before that. All of them were very different but at its heart Mother Goose is a morality tale. With other pantomimes there are clear goodies and baddies but Mother Goose herself is a much more three-dimensional character than the usual Panto tropes. She's flawed. Her journey, her wishes and her decisions drive the story forward.

In life we all make mistakes. Our Mother Goose is an acceptance of that, an ode to forgiveness and acceptance. And at Christmas, if we can't kiss and make up, when can we?

Ken has enjoyed directing many pantomimes in Scotland and across the UK.

His first foray into Pantoland was at Perth Theatre, co-directing and co-writing 'Aladdin' and 'Dick Whittington and His Cat' with panto legend Walter Carr. Since then his panto journey has taken him all over the country, from co-writing and directing 'Hansel and Gretel' with Vivien Adam for the Byre Theatre St Andrews and 'Aladdin and His Magical Lamp' with Paul Nivison for Perth Theatre, to pantos at Nottingham Theatre Royal, Plymouth Theatre Royal, New Theatre Cardiff, Northampton's Derngate, Cliffs Pavilion Southend-on-Sea, the Orchard Theatre Dartford and Richmond Theatre, with a huge variety of people, including Lesley Joseph, Simon Webbe, The Chuckle Brothers, Hilary O'Neil, Paul Zerdin, Bobby Davro, John Challis, Chico, Jeffrey Holland, Ben Nickless, Lisa Reilly, Tony Maudsley, Craig Revel Horwood, Issy Van Randwyck, Count Arthur Strong, Christopher Biggins and Basil Brush!

After training and graduating as an actor from the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama, Fraser immediately took up writing, in particular comedy writing.

His earliest writing work appeared in the Comedy Unit's Roughcuts Podcast, BBC Radio Scotland's Funny Turns and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. He wrote and produced his own radio comedy sketch show 'Macabre Cabaret' and did some stand-up comedy himself for a time. He wrote and produced two original theatre shows at the Ayr Gaiety with Jerry Taylor in the form of the 'Taylor and Boyle Show' then 'Taylor and Boyle: Licence To Tickle Your Fancy'. More recently Fraser wrote, directed and produced the touring musical production 'Hen Night Horror' to 5 star reviews and incredible audience feedback.

Since 2019 Fraser has been writing pantomimes with Ken Alexander for The Gaiety. Their first was Jack and the Beanstalk in 2019, then the pandemic struck and some creative thinking was required. The Scunner That Stole Christmas appeared on The Gaiety's Youtube channel for 2020 and the one act pantomime Jamie and the Unicorn happily appeared back on stage in 2021. 2022's Sleeping Beauty was years in the making and Cinderella in 2023 was a great success.

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
